Your generosity enables us to invest regularly in visible improvements to the facility. This off-season we are pouring concrete to create additional pool deck space located near the lap lanes. Is there such a thing as too much shade on deck? Absolutely not! That's why there will also be an extra-large shade umbrella installed in that new space.

And since there is no such thing as too much shade, for the 2019 swim season you will find two more in-water shade structures in the popular zero-depth area. We want afternoons at the pool to be both more enjoyable and safe for everyone.



At the same time, some of the most important work we do to keep the TOSA Pool running smoothly is the routine maintenance that probably goes unnoticed day to day by the public. This past year we invested in play structure repairs, giant slide refinishing, a valve replacement project and new customer service terminals. Oh...you did notice? Well, you're welcome!

## Friends of Hoyt Park & Pool is committed to a vibrant, inclusive and family-friendly experience.

Friends of Hoyt Park & Pool started as a labor of love long before we reopened this beautiful facility in 2011 as TOSA Pool at Hoyt Park. Our nonprofit organization was formed in 2006 by supporters like you who took on the mission of rebuilding and then maintaining this treasured community gathering place for generations to come, after the former Hoyt Pool was allowed to deteriorate and eventually closed in 2003.

We haven't lost sight of our core mission in these eight years of operation, including six seasons operating The Landing outdoor beer garden. TOSA Pool and The Landing are looking better than ever, thanks to diligent maintenance planning and to the support of our loyal donors, sponsors, members and guests.

This year, FOHPP embarked on a strategic planning process intended to guide the organization's future growth and improvement. As part of that process, we refined our vision for the organization: "FOHPP is committed to a vibrant, inclusive and family-friendly experience."

A lot of hard work, time and money goes into maintaining that experience. Sometimes, FOHPP has chosen to make prudent investments in visible improvements to the facility, such as the new seating area we added to the beer garden in 2017.

But some of the most important work we do to keep TOSA Pool and The Landing running smoothly is more routine. It's the maintenance work the public probably doesn't notice but that is critically important for ensuring these facilities never deteriorate again.

## THE TOSA POOL

The TOSA Pool at Hoyt Park is an award-winning outdoor community pool that provides summertime fun for all ages.

The TOSA Pool offers affordable memberships for families and individuals with daily admission rates that welcome visitors from across Southeast Wisconsin. In 2018, nearly 8,000 members enjoyed special members-only events, early entry to open swim and extended lap swimming hours.

Our strong focus on health and wellness is enhanced by swim lessons for children and adult fitness classes provided by our partnership with the Wauwatosa Recreation Department.

The TOSA Pool at Hoyt Park opened to the public May 28, 2011 and is operated by the Friends of Hoyt Park & Pool, a nonprofit group that raised money to build the pool. The pool is named in honor of the project's lead donor: The TOSA Foundation.



## THE LANDING

In 2013, the Friends of Hoyt Park & Pool opened a new seasonal beer garden, The Landing at Hoyt Park, to both create a supplementary revenue source for pool operations and to create a new space for fellowship that enriches the vibrancy of our community.

The Landing at Hoyt Park is an outdoor gathering space, where people of all ages come together and build the relationships that make our neighborhoods strong. The Landing brings more people to Hoyt Park, increasing awareness of the park and the Menomonee River as valued natural resources.

## OUR MISSION

**Community Based** Hours of operations and other programming decisions shall be based on the identified needs in the community to truly create a place where the community can come together. Standards of conduct for staff and guests will reflect the values of our community with the goal of helping to raise the citizens of tomorrow.

**Customer Focused** "Clean and beautiful" will be an operational goal at all times – cleanliness and aesthetics on-deck, on the grounds and in the building are commitments we make to the community. Opportunities for customers to provide feedback and become involved in the volunteer activities of the organization will be encouraged.



## THE JOURNEY

When a group of community volunteers came together to see what could be done about restoring Hoyt Park, we were optimistic that with the help of our partners, Milwaukee County Parks and the TOSA Foundation, the Friends of Hoyt Park & Pool would see swimming return to the heart of Wauwatosa and the park be a center of activity.

### LATE 1800'S

People swam on the banks of the Menomonee River



### 1932

Local residents swam in a sand-bottom swimming hole filled annually by the fire department with water from the river. Note the diving platform.

### 1939-2003

Milwaukee County operates the Hoyt Park Pool for the benefit of county residents.

### 2003

Milwaukee County closed Hoyt Pool citing severe structural problems causing water leaks that made operations too expensive.



### 2006

Friends of Hoyt Park & Pool, a grassroots group of volunteers, formed to revitalize the park and bring the 100-year swimming tradition back to our community.



### 2006

FOHPP hosts our first community fundraiser – a used Toy Sale in the Hoyt Park parking lot. Local elementary children got involved, donating their toys to help raise money to build the pool.

### 2007

FOHPP successfully negotiated a 55-year lease with Milwaukee County in July 2007 giving FOHPP control over the design/build process and the ongoing operations of the new pool at Hoyt Park.



### 2007-2008



Successful fundraisers were held with the support of many local businesses and community members: Hearts for Hoyt & II which featured auctions and live entertainment, a sporting goods resale, and an ice cream social at the pool bathhouse.

### 2009

Thanks to the generosity of the TOSA Foundation, other foundations and many community members, FOHPP raises enough money to begin construction of a new pool at Hoyt Park and to renovate the historic bathhouse.



### SUMMER, 2010

Diggin to Dive In! A Community Groundbreaking Celebration featured more than 100 kids with toy shovels and hard hats, as well as accompanying adults who brought their own shovels. It was followed by an afternoon of fun, music and food – and a notable bullfrog rescue. The old pool is demolished over the summer; early-stage construction work on the pool begins.

### MAY, 2010

Kids at area public and private elementary schools raise money by bringing in spare change for an "Adopt-a-Drop" campaign. The winning school received a certificate for an all-school family swim night.

## SEPTEMBER, 2010

The FOHPP Ecology Committee works with The Park People to host 4 highly successful “Weed Outs” to begin the journey of eradicating invasive weeds and help beautify the 32-acre Hoyt Park while The TosaPOOLooza Benefit Concert rocks Milwaukee County’s Historical Society, featuring surprise musical guest Willy Porter.



## NOVEMBER, 2010

The Wauwatosa Recreation Department is selected as FOHPP’s programming provider for the new pool.



## SPRING, 2011

“Finish work” is done on the pool: pool surfacing, inside the fence landscaping, water features, and extensive deck work. Milwaukee County provides a beautiful new parking lot, extensive work on pathway improvement, and park lighting.

## MAY 28, 2011

The TOSA Pool at Hoyt Park opens to the public.



## JULY, 2013

The Landing at Hoyt Park opens featuring European-style picnic tables, a variety of local and international beer and wine, and occasional live music. It becomes a favorite community gathering place for all generations to share a picnic lunch, The Landing’s gourmet pretzels, and a favorite libation – all amidst the natural beauty of Hoyt Park.



## SPRING, 2013

FOHPP approves construction of The Landing at Hoyt Park – a seasonal beer garden on the north end of the historic bathhouse to complement pool operations and bring more people to Hoyt Park throughout three seasons.



## AUGUST, 2016

FOHPP holds its first TOSA Youth Tri, drawing more than 170 young competitors to Hoyt Park to swim, bike and run. The event would go on to top 200 registrations in its second year.

## SPRING, 2015

The Grand Hall is renovated to preserve its 1930s-era craftsmanship while adding acoustic panels, pendant lighting, flat screen TVs and a 10-foot screen with projector, offering a venue for watching sports events and other presentations.



## MAY, 2017

TOSA Pool’s season opens with its first in-house lifeguard crew after a monthslong recruitment and training process aimed at improving consistency in staffing while maintaining safety standards.



# TOSA Pool

Friends of Hoyt Park & Pool opened the TOSA Pool at Hoyt Park in 2011 after several years of successful fundraising and thanks to the generosity of the TOSA Foundation. Members enjoy several members-only events including an evening swim followed by an outdoor movie night on the “green beach”.



## Historic Bathhouse

The 1930s bathhouse from the former Hoyt Pool features terrazzo marble floors, a stone fireplace and wood paneling. From the beginning, we were determined to preserve the WPA-built structure, and it now houses our Grand Hall, available for special events and for rental year round for reunions, birthdays, business meetings and even weddings.



## The Landing

The Landing at Hoyt Park has been a big part of FOHPP's success story since the outdoor beer garden opened in 2013. The helpful staff at The Landing serve up pizza, popcorn, pretzels and food specials, as well as selections from our changing menu of local craft and imported beers and fine wine. We have made further improvements to the facility, including additional outdoor seating and shade structures and a mobile service station. The Landing continues to be a great place for dining outdoors, socializing, listening to live music, playing trivia or just enjoying Hoyt Park's natural beauty.



## Grand Hall

We are continuing to fill our historic Grand Hall with activity year round, and 2018 was our busiest year yet for private rentals, from class reunions to wedding rehearsal dinners. Our staff members pride themselves on ensuring every detail is just right, and after a 2015 renovation, the hall now has flat screen TVs and a 10-foot screen with projector, perfect for our popular Badgers and Packers viewing parties. The Grand Hall also has helped make this an all-weather facility, with live music and trivia nights moving inside as needed.
